The purpose of Access 21 is to provide learning opportunities that will help to address high school, college, and workforce readiness and success. Courses are taught by professional educators from Haverhill High and qualified personnel recruited from the community.

Access 21 will provide an afternoon snack, as well as transportation home at 5:15 p.m. To maintain enrollment, students must attend regularly. Students who fail to maintain regular attendance will forfeit their slot and be replaced by students on the waiting list. There will be three (approximately) 10 week sessions this year from October 11 to May 31.
